VCE Unit 4 Drama

Non-Naturalistic Solo Performance

Time Allocation

This unit of work will consist of approximately 100 hours of which at least 50 hours will be class time. **To complete this unit of work satisfactorily, students must complete each of the following learning outcomes.**

Learning Outcomes

Outcome 1

On completion of this outcome the student should be able to devise a solo performance in response to given stimulus material and describe the non-naturalistic qualities of the performance.

Outcome 2 – End of year performance exam

On completion of this outcome the student should be able to create, develop and perform a non-naturalistic drama solo in response to a prescribed structure.

Outcome 3

On completion of this outcome the student should be able to analyse and evaluate the creation, development and a devised non-naturalistic performance.

End of year written exam

The student will answer a series of questions requiring short and extended responses highlighting their knowledge of the course.

Assessment Tasks

1. Short Solo Performance (Outcome 1)

Create, and present a short solo performance based on stimulus material and write an evaluation of the processes used.

Weighting: This task is worth 5% of the overall grade (/20) **Time allocated to task:** 8 periods

Due: Term 2, Week 10

2. Solo Performance (Outcome 2)

On completion of this unit the student should be able to create, develop and perform a character or characters within a solo performance in response to a prescribed structure.

Weighting: This task is worth 35% of the overall study score

Time allocated to task: 30 periods

3. Solo Performance Review (Outcome 3)

Describe, analyse and evaluate the creation, development and presentation of a solo performance..

Weighting: This task is worth 5% of the overall grade (/20)

Time allocated to task: 5 periods

Due: Term 3, Week 10

4. Semester Examination

Students will answer a series of questions requiring short and extended responses. Stimulus material, dramatic element/s, performance style/s and/or theatrical convention/s may be provided for some questions.

Weighting: This task is worth 25% of the overall study score

Time allocated to task: 20 periods
